Welfare Trust, Village- Kudana Chak, Near Brijghat, District-Amroha, Uttar Pradesh to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of Sanjeevani Ayurvedic Medical College, Village- Kudana Chak, Near Brijghat, District-Amroha, Uttar Pradesh with 100 seats in BAMS course Under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 from the academic session 2016-17 – Letter of Intent-regarding.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your application No. SGC/96/15 dated 28.04.2015 on the subject cited above and to say that the proposal was sent to the Central Council of Indian Medicine on 26.05.2015 to examine the application, carry out an inspection of the proposed college and forward their recommendations. A copy of the letter was also sent to you.

2. After careful consideration of the scheme and taking into consideration the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM in terms of the regulation 6 and sub-regulation (2) of regulation 9 of regulations namely “the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2003 read with Amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant Regulations made thereunder, the Ministry of AYUSH has decided to issue a **Letter of Intent** to the Secretary, S.G.C. Welfare Trust, Village- Kudana Chak, Near Brijghat, District-Amroha, Uttar Pradesh to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of Sanjeevani Ayurvedic Medical College, Village- Kudana Chak, Near Brijghat, District-Amroha, Uttar Pradesh with 100 seats in BAMS course Under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 from the academic session 2016-17 subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled before the inspection by the CCIM regarding the matter for consideration for issuance of Letter of permission (LoP) for the academic session 2016-17, failing which Letter of Permission (LoP) shall not be issued and Letter of Intent (LoI) issued shall be deemed to be withdrawn:

- i. the applicant shall fulfill all the relevant requirements of infrastructure for teaching and training facilities as specified in the Regulations 3 and 10 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012" read with subsequently amended Regulations time to time as on the day of visitation;
 - ii. the applicant shall fulfil all the relevant requirements of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) (Amendment) Regulations, 2012" read with subsequently amended Regulations time to time as on the day of visitation;
 - iii. the applicant shall fulfil all the relevant provisions of Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2003" read with amendment Regulations of 2013; and
 - iv. the applicant shall fulfil all the relevant provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970.
3. The applicant is also to submit the requisite performance bank guarantee of Rs. One crore fifty lakhs (Rs. One crore for fifty lakhs for 61 -100 UG seats) as specified under the section 6 (1) (g) of notified Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2003" read with amendment Regulations of 2013.
4. The college administration is to ensure that no student is admitted in the above mentioned UG course till the formal permission by issue of Letter of Permission (LoP) of the Central Government is granted.
5. In the event, the applicant college fails to comply with or satisfy the conditions of the Letter of Intent; the Letter of Intent shall be deemed to have been withdrawn, without further intimation to the applicant.
6. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.
7. This issues with the approval of competent authority.


